Your new LBYC board is heeding the above caution and is already hard at work, even though next summer seems far away. Board meeting notes do not make for high drama, especially in comparison to the recent national election, but here are some actions taken at our first two meetings:

We appointed a committee to plan for LBYC's 125th anniversary in 2018. Committee members are Bill and Peg Hudson, Don and Carol Stein, Robert and Carol Klement, Monty and Chris Mackey, and Steve and Mary Schmitendorf. The committee welcomes your ideas.

We decided against a kitchen rental agreement with Toothpicks, our favorite caterer. Toothpicks had proposed using the kitchen year-round to do their cooking

in return for rent payments and further favorable support of our social events. The board decided there were too many potential unintended consequences of linking the club with a commercial venture. This decision will not affect our terrific relationship with Toothpicks.

We are revising the club's beverage policy to emphasize that alcohol for all events must be purchased by the club from a licensed distributor, in accordance with state law. The revised policy will also clarify that event budgets must include reimbursing the club at the regular drink prices set by the board, even if the event wishes to provide free or reduced price drinks. This maintains our profit margin on the bar, which is a key source of revenue.

We authorized submitting bids for 2018, 2019, or 2020 to host the Opti No Tears Regatta, the Opti Inland Championships, the C Invitational, and the Wiscon-



sin MC Championship. We will also host the 2018 Quad Lakes X Regatta.

The board wants all our actions and decisions to be in the best interests of the club. Feel free to contact me or any board member with your questions, comments, and suggestions.

The 100 people attending the October 1 post-Olympic celebration for Annie Haeger experienced a special evening unlike anything we have seen at LBYC. The food and company were great, with three internationally-known sailors and one new potential Olympic campaigner attending. Mark Smith did a fabulous job honoring Annie, but the real centerpiece of the evening was Annie's talk and slides about her experience, followed by a noholds-barred Q&A session. Annie opened herself up to us, and did so with poise, grace,

and humor. It was truly remarkable.

It would be impossible to repeat all of the good stuff we heard, but here are some highlights of her talk:

The US Sailing Team journey to the Olympic event began with a send-off in Houston. The team members got tons of custom-fit swag from Nike and Ralph Lauren, and had their names featured in lights.

The Rio Olympic village held 10,000 athletes, with a central dining hall and shared gym. Annie described the dining hall as an animal watering hole, and struggled to get her daily caffeine fix, with only six coffee machines for


their effort.



everyone. Team USA had its own building in the village, but was not allowed to display the U.S. flag for security reasons.

The crowded conditions and security made it difficult to follow a routine and get time alone. All the athletes were followed by U.S. Secret Service agents. Transportation to the sailing venue was by scheduled bus.

The opening ceremony was filled with feelings of pride for country and unity with all the world's athletes. Yes, she got to meet Michael Phelps. She also became friendly with Gabby Douglas during the event.

For Team HP, the sailing was a constant battle to make up ground despite crazy conditions (12' waves on the outer courses) and equipment issues. They



battled back from some poor starts and a mainsail halyard failure, and were sitting in 2nd place after 3 days. On day 4, heading in to shore with a front coming in, they capsized in a 39 mph gust and couldn't get the mainsail down, resulting in significant wear on the sail. The Olympic equipment "police" wouldn't let them use a new mainsail for the remainder of the event, which rattled them.

Despite the challenges, Team HP was in 3rd overall approaching the medal race, with a chance for bronze or silver. On the first beat, they got a favorable shift and led at the first mark. They were not able to extend their lead downwind. After rounding, they saw other teams inside hitching up, and tried to tack and consolidate, but couldn't cross. so had to tack back. This cost them some boats, but they still rounded the



last windward mark in striking distance. Unfortunately, they fouled an aggressive Japanese team on the downwind and that was the killer. Annie described it as having your heart ripped out.

Annie's summation of her experience was heartwarming. Team HP named their boat "Lose Yourself," to mark the total commitment it takes to succeed. The result, for Annie, was that she found herself, and even though the pain is still real, will come out of this stronger. She also knows what it would look like if she decides to try again. We can assure her that LBYC will be behind her whatever she decides.

Bread and Circus Sailing at the Nan Norris Memorial

Sailing on Lake Beulah with larger skilled fleets has been characterized as ARENA sailing, because of the close quarter action.. This year, Lake Beulah gave fresh baked LBYC loaves of bread to all of the sailors, possibly a first in sailing history. Mindful of the ARENA SAILING definition together with the free FRESH BREAD, one could say that Lake Beulah has created a unique event in the world of sailing which we can define as BREAD AND CIRCUS SAILING. Not unlike the ancient events in the coliseum of Rome in which carnage was a frequent spectacle. Regrettably, there was no carnage this year for the second year in a row.

The Nan Norris Memorial (Beulah Challenge) was held the weekend of September 24, 25 in magnificent Indian summer weather with gentle breezes out of the east. Beulah's Milt Haeger with assistance from son Matt ran the races to perfection. Kudos go to them and the entire race committee.

Opening night Friday began with a "learn to shuck" OYSTER bar including fresh shrimp flown in straight from a family shrimp boat. There were two oyster types. One was WELLFLEET oysters from Cape Cod which are a reasonably sweet and famous oyster. The second were Malpeque oysters from Prince Edward Island Canada, a more meaty yet still sweet oyster. Over thirty loaves of fresh baked bread were meant for making PO BOY sandwiches, however, the shrimp and oysters were apparently so good that no one bothered. They chased it all down with New Orleans style, HURRICANE drinks.

Day one sailing had three races with light easterly to northeasterly breezes on a race course that stretched from Buck Island, to Jeff Lippert's house. Most challenging was a wind that came out of Jesuit Island and Oster's bay with

at many times little or no visibility. Sailors who were trying to race by seeing the wind were thus challenged because the wind was oftentimes invisable. As Charlie Kutschenreuter so ably described it, "Every time I tried to think and see the wind and make tactical decisions I was wrong, and every time I followed the fleet blindly I was right, so I stopped thinking". Sailing blind into a hole proved to be a good decision often. Ann Porter seemed to get it right more than others.

The Saturday night party again had MARGARITAS made the traditional way and tenderloin steak fajitas under the magnificent leadership of Teri Ann Norris, Beth Kutschenreuter and the many members of the team. A Latin band played for 3 hours.

Sunday morning we had the excellent pancake breakfast pioneered 44 years ago in 1962 by Nan Norris and her husband and now sponsored generously by the Sullivans. Posters of the 1962 breakfast were on the LBYC walls.

Sunday the wind shifted slightly to the southeast and increased somewhat and the course went from Beulah Beach to Stumpf's bay. In the end, the regatta was won by Beulah's' Jay Hiller with son Tommy crewing for him. They narrowly beat Anne Porter.

We are in our third year of creating and defining a unique sailing regatta in both sailing and social aspects. In 2015, we created an image or logo of the regatta, along with a website and our first annual poster, "HEY BIG BOY'. In 2016, we again produced a main poster, "THINK BIG BLOW." A poster homage to Milt Haeger and Walter Schwarting, aka "SALTY". "Think Big Blow" was a term coined by Will Norris and Gary Nikolas, with others, for Salty at PYC in the early 1970's. It was put on Salty Buttons for a number of years thereafter. Our tag line this year which added to it, was "You know how to blow don't you, you just put your lips together and.." which was inspired by the book and movie "To Have and Have Not" of Humphrey Bogart, Lauren Bacall and Hemingway fame in which Lauren whispers a similar line to Bogart. It is the 34th most famous line in cinema history. This author was first drawn to film noir and old comedy movies by Milt Haeger, who inspired and introduced him to film history and who could quote comedians from the 1930's.

The poster art takes roughly 1 to 1 1/2 years each to complete. Next year, 2017 will feature new art along with a number of supplemental pieces, some inspired from this year's events as part of a planned series. The logo and art is an attempt at a visual sailing narrative, encompassing sailing history and philosophy.

The Nan Norris Memorial Regatta or "NANCY", honors Nancy Norris and her friends, Gan Haeger, Marcia Berman, Gretchen Oster, and Marge Harvey who mentored young sailors on Lake Beulah for over a half century. It began and still is a Beulah Challenge.
